Beavertown Borough Council met on Tuesday, September 10, 2019

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

GUESTS: Robin Kauffman & Natalie Chesney (Revitalization Committee, Officer Shaffer, Corporal Joel Zimmerman (St. Police). Corporal Zimmerman reviewed traffic accidents; in 2018 there were 67 and to present 38, on 522 (Market St.).

MINUTES, BILLS and TREASURERS REPORT: Denny motioned to approve the minutes; Ron second, with a roll call vote-unanimous yes-motion carried. Linda motioned to approve the bills; Lucas second, with a roll call vote-unanimous yes-motion carried. Denny motioned to approve treasurer's report; Ron second, with a roll call vote-unanimous yes-motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS: None.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT: None.

MAYOR'S REPORT: The Mayor reviewed properties, residents' concerns and reported that he has to update the Census. Community Day will be held on October 5th, at 11:00 a.m.; there will be free food, drinks and entertainment, followed by the food giveaway. Also attending Community Day will be, Fred Keller, Representative David Rowe, Commissioners and a Ceremony dedicating the land from Conestoga to build a building in which to hold future food giveaways. October 17th will be Fire Prevention Night, 6 p.m. – 8 p.m. Beavertown has gotten the grant for repairing sidewalks; Mayor will contact CK COG to come and do sidewalk inspections. He completed grant applications for the Fire Co. and Ambulance.

BOROUGH SUPERVISOR'S REPORT: They did patching around town and put up new stop signs. Repaired a hydraulic line on the mower, fixed a belt on the pickup, and weeded flower beds at borough bldg., filled in ruts from the paving crew. He is planning on redoing the benches in the playground.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Deposits: General Fund – EIT \$11,842.63, Real Estate \$274.62, Delinquent Real Estate \$320.14, Per Capita \$49.50, Delinquent Per Capita \$33.00, Vol. Fire Regional Pool 2016 \$107.44, Realty Transfer \$2,479.40, Donations for Max Lash \$75.00, Room Rent from August Election \$75.00, Total = \$15,256.73. Payroll – BMA-Sewer \$2,245.69, BMA-Water \$1,516.58 Total = \$3,762.27. LST – LST \$2,027.33, Fines \$406.16, Total = \$2,433.49. Pat reviewed a RTK form with Solicitor Cravitz and he advised that only the information requested on Borough Employees had to be given. The Library wanted to know if the Borough would have their carpet cleaned; Council felt that is not the Borough's responsibility to have the carpet cleaned.

NEW BUSINESS: Ron asked if the ash trees at the ball field could be cut down. Ron motioned for Phil to get quotes on cutting the ash trees down; Denny second, with a roll call vote-unanimous yes-motioned carried. Phil will get quotes.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: Natalie presented and reviewed the survey results from the Revitalization Committee. Personnel and Budget Committees will need to start meeting.
